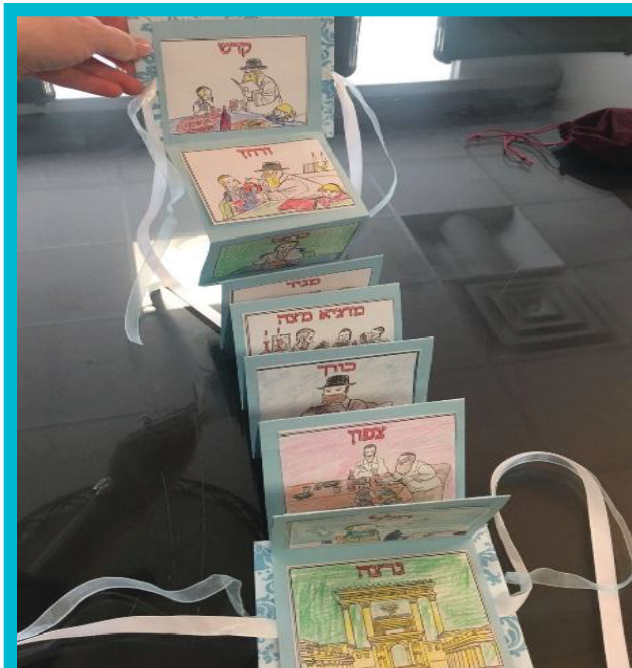


STEPS OF THE PESACH SEDER ACCORDION FOLDABLE



Materials Needed:

- Cardstock
- Scotch tape
- Pictures of the steps of the seder (see attached)
- Two pieces of cardboard, (they will be cut to be slightly larger than one of the panels of the accordion)
- Two pieces of scrapbook paper or pretty paper, to cover the two pieces of cardboard
- 4 pieces of ribbon, cut to the same size
- Scissors
- Glue
- Optional: Crayons or markers

1. Cut out each of the pictures.
3. Take the sheets of cardstock and tape them together to form a long string of sheets, using the pictures as a guide for the size. The cardstock should form a thin frame around each of the pictures (see photo).
4. Trim the cardstock as necessary.
5. Fold the long string of cardstock back and forth, using an accordion or zigzag fold. Each panel should be the same size and should be big enough to form a frame around one of the simanei haseder pictures.
6. Glue one of the pictures onto each of the panels. They will all be glued on the same side of the accordion.
7. For the covers: Take one piece of cardboard. Trace onto the cardboard around one of the panels of the accordion so that the cardboard is slightly bigger than the panel. Cut out the piece of cardboard.
8. Take one piece of scrapbook paper and wrap it around the piece of cardboard, as you would wrap a present.
9. Lay the wrapped piece of cardboard on the table so that the messier side is facing up.
10. Glue two ribbons across the middle of the cardboard, lengthwise. Two ribbons should now be hanging over each of the sides of the cardboard.
11. Glue the first panel of the accordion on top of the ribbons, with the picture facing up, so that the ends of the scrapbook paper are covered and the two ribbons stick out from both sides of the panel.
12. Repeat steps 7-11 with the other piece of the cardboard, to form the back cover of the foldable.
13. Tie the ribbons together to close the foldable.

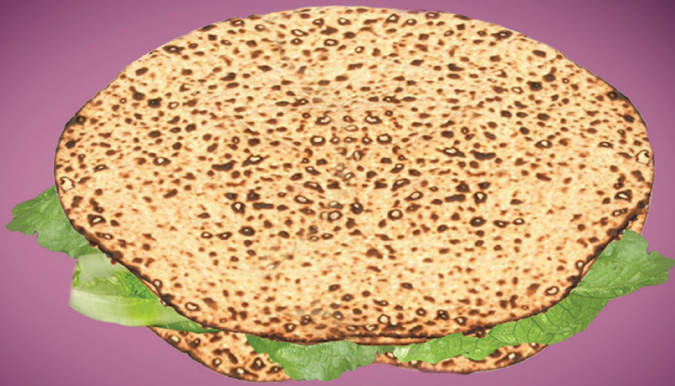
